This week, Willow Green have started the new term as we mean to go on, with the start of our new learning journeys. In Year One, the children have begun exploring the weather and seasons and this week explored the different types of weather that we see. In Year Two, the children began to learn about Mexico and enjoyed exploring maps to find out where Mexico is compared to England. In Year Three, the children have begun exploring mining communities and the physical and human features of these locations. Year 1 Weekly Attendance: 93%

What a super week across EY. Children in the unit have started their new books. In FS1, they've looked at "The Enormous Turnip' and in FS2 "Oliver's Vegetables". FS1 have been building sculptures inside and out whilst learning about Antony Gormley. Our FS2 children have been learning about things more locally such as the changes to Pontefract Castle and our local area over time. We are excited for next week and the crawling visitors we will be meeting. We will also be getting some little creepy crawly pets.



Year 2

What a great first week back! In writing, we have started a new unit, all about Fae Folk. We have had lots of interesting talks about fairies, goblins and sprites. In maths, we have continued with our money topic, focussing on making different amounts using different coins and notes. We have been very lucky this half term as we have both forest schools and Elite for PE! In PE, we have worked hard on our gymnastics and stretching skills. It was so much fun!





Year 5

What a busy week it has been in Year 5! In design and technology we have experimented with weights and pulleys, both building them practically and sketching them in our sketch books. We have also spent time in RE researching the Roman Catholics, compiling fact files that will aid us in our future lessons. We spent the evenings playing bingo, roasting marshmallows and playing more board games.
