


Head of Academy's Message Whole School Attendance: 94%



Year 1 Weekly Attendance: 96%

This week, Year One have been working on subtractions in our maths lessons. We have learnt to write subtraction number sentences and calculate them on our Rekenreks. We have then applied this to write and solve subtraction number sentences. We have also started innovating our defeat the monster stories. We have stories about snowmen, ducks, princesses and fairies and some very scary wolves, ogres, trolls and aliens who try and eat everything in the gardens. Ask the children how their character defeats the monster. You won't believe some of the ideas we have! Alongside this in science, we have been learning about the words bendy, stiff and stretchy. In FS1, in pre phonics our focus has been compound words. With the support of picture cards we practised putting two words together to make the compound word. In Maths, children have been learning about patterns in the environment and what shapes and colours they can see. Next week, they will be learning about repeating patterns! In FS2, children have been creating their own stories and thinking about the parts of the story, such as: opening, build up, problem, resolution and ending. They have made some incredible pieces of work which are so imaginative! In Maths, we have been learning all about shapes. We know the similarities about rectangles and squares, ask us about how many sides a rectangle has and why this is different to a square! Both FS1 & FS2 have enjoyed making pizza this week, chopping, dicing and weighing the healthy ingredients and kneading the dough to make sure it is tasty!

This week, we have been writing our innovate pieces on the Great Fire of London. To support this learning, we used our drama skills to create freeze frames – re-enacting the people of London attempting to put out the fire using buckets and fire hooks. In Art, we compared charcoal drawings by William Kentridge and Frank Auerbach.

Year 4 Weekly Attendance: 96%

It's been another busy week in Year 4. In writing not only have we completed our hot write for our suspense stories we have also started our new non-fiction unit looking at recounts. In maths we have continued to work on our skills of multiplication and division with great success in both our 6- and 9-times tables. Reading has seen us be introduced to a new character the space bat angle dragon! Time has been spent analysing what has been said about the new character to understand who and what he is. This week in Art we have, been busy recreation George Segal's sculpture process, we evaluated its strength and weaknesses, from both the sculptors and models perspective. Great fun was had during the process as we wrapped each other up on toilet roll! Year 4 have been putting a lot of effort into their Christmas Carol concert with a lot of time being spent during the afternoons rehearsing and revising the songs. It most definitely paid off with two fabulous performances at church.



Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 89%

Our budding artists have been continuing with watercolours, exploring ways to add texture to their artworks. Techniques including experimenting with different brush strokes for varied textures, flicking the paintbrush and using sponges to create different textures. In the realm of mathematics, we've been navigating the landscape of fractions. Specifically, our focus has been on comparing fractions. Students have engaged in hands-on activities, using visuals like fraction bars and pie charts to deepen their understanding of fraction relationships. Our young writers have been honing their skills in crafting discussion texts. After weeks of exploring various topics, organizing arguments, and refining their writing, they've embarked on their final pieces. The writing process has emphasized the importance of persuasive language, strong supporting evidence, and respectful discourse. These skills extend beyond the classroom, preparing our students for effective communication in various contexts.
