

Year 1 Weekly Attendance: 91%

Year 1 have worked so hard this week! We are so proud of how independent they have been coming through the classroom door by themselves. In our writing this week we have been looking at improving our sentences with nouns, adjectives and similes. We made silly simile sentences to help us - why not ask your child what their silly simile was? We began our Geography topic all about maps this week. We looked around our school and spotted the features. How can you help? Try asking your child each day what sound they learnt in phonics. This helps them to consolidate their phonics knoweldge!



Year 3 Weekly Attendance: 94%

WOW! What an amazing week we have had in Year 3. We started the week with something strange in our classroom... it looked like Little Red Riding Hood and the wolf had been to visit. We used our detective skills to work out what we thought had happened and then created some amazing stories linking it all together. As well as this, we have enjoyed starting our new text "This Morning I Met A Whale" in reading. We have focused on predicition, using the images and text to create well thought through answers.

Weekly Attendance: 98%

What a wonderful second week here in EY. Our little learners have settled in very well to the routines. Our cloakroom looks less like a teenagers room and more organised. Its lovely to see the excitement on their faces as we learn something new or discover exciting new things. Our nature walk was so much fun. We began to identify how over time things have changed and the leaves are going from green to brown and orange. We have used new vocabulary correctly to describe the change of season. Inside the unit our little learners have been starting to explore texts in Talk for write and have been using their maths skills to count and explore colour. Our littlest learners have been exploring out school environment and listening out for sounds, we were super impressed with their listening skills for the instructions. The FS2 lunchtime is less chaotic and they can grab a tray, cutlery and carry all their dinner to their seat without dropping it, SUCCESS! Year 2 weekly Attendance: 90%

Year 2 have been absolutely amazing this week. In writing, we have completed our descriptions of different animals such as an elephant calf and a mob of meerkats. In maths, we have been using our number line skills to count in tens and ones between 0 and 100! The highlights from this week have to include how much effort they have all put into their phonics work, how engaged everyone was during our PE sessions, and how beautiful our art work based on collages are already starting to look. What a great start and I can't wait to see what comes next!





Year 4 Weekly Attendance: 85%

This week, Year 4 received a mysterious letter, telling us about a character called Princess Isolde and her warning story. We created freeze frames to tell the story and began to learn it off by heart using actions. We also wrote some character descriptions, trying to use new vocabulary such as 'vanity' and 'veiled.' In PE, we used our team work skills to tackle some trickier ball skills. In Maths, we used number lines to order numbers up to 10,000.

Year 5 Weekly Attendance: 96%

It has been a busy week in Year 5. In writing we have analysed poetry about Roman soldiers, linking to our history topic, and have experimented with the use of dialogue to add action to a story with the aim of exciting the reader. Reading has seen us explore the front cover blurb and first 2 pages of our book 'Street Child', we have been using clues given to us to predict what the plot of the story maybe and who the main character is. In maths we have been working with numbers up to 1,000,000. In History we have taken a trip to our school timeline to help us understand when different time periods happened, how long they lasted, and what periods of history happened at the same time or overlapped, this will then help us construct our own timelines next week.



Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 100%

This week, we explored how dialogue can be used to convey a character's emotions in writing, helping students understand the deeper layers of storytelling. We also examined information texts centered around the Gunpowder Plot, enhancing their comprehension of historical events through nonfiction. In maths, students focused on place value, rounding, and comparing and ordering numbers to strengthen their number sense and accuracy. Additionally, in history, we studied the Tudor monarchs, learning about their shifting religious policies and the impact these changes had during the Tudor period.
