Year 2 Weekly Attendance: 93%

Year 2 have had a great start back after the October half term break. In history, we have started our new topic all around The Great Fire Of London. We have learnt about how the fire started and who our important person 'Samuel Pepys' was. This has linked brilliantly to our writing which is based off the story 'The Baker's Mistake'. To get engaged, Year 2 tried different baked breads and used our fantastic adjectives to describe each one and decide on their favourites. Year 4 Weekly Attendance: 96%

We have had a great first week back in Year 4! We continued our work on Animals Including Humans in Science, completing an exciting experiment around digestion which involved using a pretend mouth full of food and recreating its journey through the body. We also began our new writing unit, learning our model text *The Adventure at Sandy Cove* off by heart with some accompanying actions. In art, we looked at famous sculptor George Segal and recreated some of his work in groups using toilet roll!

Year 5 Weekly Attendance: 97%

It has been a brilliant first week back after half term for Year five! We have been busy creating suspense sorties based on a short clip from a video and have even written our own suspense poems about snakes in the night. In maths, we have been looking at common multiples and factors, which has lead to us completing some practical lessons.

Geography has seen us delve into tectonic plates and how they can cause mountains, earthquakes, and volcanoes! The highlight of our week was most definitely our first mood booster session, where we got creative, made fortune tellers which gave us helpful hints to help us brighten our mood!



Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 96%

This week, we began our geography unit by exploring how different places vary in terms of culture, landscape, and climate. In RE, we examined artwork across Christianity, discussing the similarities and differences in how faith and religious stories are represented through various artistic styles. In maths, we started a new unit on fractions, beginning by consolidating key Year 5 objectives to ensure a strong foundation before moving on to more advanced concepts.
